

Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Fishing – Hiking – Hunting – Outdoor Photography – Wildlife Viewing

Conservation areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities. Parking or storing watercraft or commercial vehicles on department areas during closed hours is prohibited.

- No littering.
- No free-running pets. Dogs must be leashed or confined when not being trained or used for hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use.
- Motor vehicles are restricted to graveled roadways and parking areas.
- No bicycling or horseback riding opportunities except on public roadways.
- Camping is allowed on or adjacent to all graveled area parking lots. No unattended open campfires allowed. Groups of 10 campers or more or special activities may require a Special Use Permit. Contact Area Manager for further information. Stays are limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period.
- Walk-in camping is allowed year round, EXCEPT during all firearms deer and turkey seasons. During these seasons camping is only allowed on or adjacent to graveled area parking lots.
- Target shooting is permitted only on designated public shooting ranges or by special use permit.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing and sailboating are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Area is open to fishing under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply.

- Fishing is permitted on all waters of the area throughout the year.
- On Fox Valley Lake and area ponds, fish may be taken only by pole and line and no more than three poles or rods with attached lines may be used by any person at any time.
- On Fox Valley Lake and area ponds, daily creel limits are six black bass and four catfish in the aggregate and 30 crappie. The daily limit for all other species combined is 20.
- On Fox Valley Lake and area ponds all largemouth bass between 12 and 15 inches in total length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught. Fish are measured laid flat from tip of snout with mouth closed to end of tail with tail lobes pressed together.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited on all impounded waters and their discharge channels.

- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written permission of the Conservation Department.
- Outboard motors in excess of 10 horsepower must be operated at slow, no-wake speed on Fox Valley Lake.
- Electric motors only are allowed on area ponds.

Hunting and Trapping

Area is open to hunting under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply.

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Booklets for current regulations.
- Only portable tree stands may be placed or used and only between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Each stand must be identified with the name and address of the user and must be removed from the area by Feb. 1. Use of nails or other materials that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Decoys and blinds are permitted but must be disassembled and removed daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Trapping of furbearers allowed only with a special-use permit from area manager.
- Trail cameras are prohibited.


