


Directions to Area

Hunting – Wildlife Viewing



Rules and Regulations

Open for public use from 4:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.; hunting, fishing, trapping, camping, dog training allowed 24 hours a day where these activities are permitted.

- Nuts, berries, fruits, edible wild greens and mushrooms may be taken only for personal consumption.
- Walk-in/backpack camping is allowed. No amenities are provided. Seasonal closures and restrictions may apply.
- Pets and hunting dogs are permitted but must be on a leash or confined at all time. Hunting

dogs may be used off the leash and unconfined for hunting and training purposes. **Hunting permit required to train dogs in pursuit of wildlife.**

- Target shooting is prohibited.
- No horseback riding opportunities exist on this area.

Hunting and Trapping

- Only archery and muzzleloading methods may be used. All other statewide deer seasons and limits apply.
- Only portable stands are allowed from Sept. 1 through Jan. 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled or on a durable material with the full name and address or Conservation number of the owner and be removed from the area by Feb. 1st. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Blinds may be constructed on-site only from wil-lows (*Salicaceae*) and nonwoody vegetation.
- Trapping allowed only with special use permit.


