

Area Highlights


Gravois Creek CA provides forested open space adjacent to St. Louis County's Grant's Trail. Gravois Creek transects the 14 acre conservation area. To find Gravois Creek CA take Reavis Barracks Road to Avenue H. Access is through the Gateway Trailnet's Grant's Trail. Hiking and biking opportunities are available on area access trails and on the adjacent Grant's Trail, owned and managed by St. Louis County Parks.


This Conservation Area is open 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.

- No open fires or fireworks.
- Camping is prohibited.
- Horseback riding is prohibited.
- Bicycling is allowed on designated trails and public roadways.
- Motor vehicles are allowed in parking areas only.
- No target shooting is allowed.
- Dogs must be leashed at all times.
- Nuts, berries, fruits and mushrooms may be taken for personal use. Digging, cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- No capture or removal of any wildlife.
- No picking, collection, destruction or defacing of any natural objects.



Fishing and Boating

Fishing is permitted under statewide regulations.


